Course Description: Middle school Spanish in PYLUSD is the equivalent of high school Spanish 1 taken over a period of two years. Seventh grade students who complete Spanish 1A will continue their studies and take Spanish 1B next year as eighth graders. **Students with a C- or better in BOTH courses will receive credit for the full year of high school Spanish 1.** Spanish 1A is an introductory course designed to help students begin to develop fluency and proficiency in listening, in speaking, in reading, and in writing Spanish. Using Total Physical Response, Teaching Proficiency through Reading and Storytelling, and other strategies, students will address a wide variety of age and stage appropriate topics as they develop their ability to communicate effectively in the target language in real-world encounters. They will also begin to learn to control the many components of Spanish grammar. Students will explore various cultures of Hispanic people around the world; including a study of geography, history, cultural traditions, art, music and daily life. Upon completion of this course, students will be able to communicate about daily life in common settings, comprehend spoken Spanish, and begin to speak and write with fluency.

Classroom expectations:

Rewards

- Verbal praise and encouragement
- Recognition of actions reflecting Respect, Responsibility, or Teamwork will be given using the 5-Star app. 5-Star points may be redeemed for special prizes or privileges. Students may want to download the 5-Star Student app to track their points.
- For participating in class during academic activities, “¡Bravo!” tickets may be handed out. 3 ¡Bravos! = 5 Class Participation points. They can be turned in at any time during the year.

Assignments: Assignments are posted daily on [our class website](#) and on [Google Classroom](#).

Help: I am generally available before school and at break for students who need extra help. Students may request help sessions with me in person, or electronically via email. There are also many online resources available through our class website, www.senyorm.com. Students can check assignment due dates, do review activities, and utilize many other resources.

Make-Up Work: Homework will be assigned frequently and will be checked for completion during the following class day. Late homework is accepted for fewer points (20% lower each class day it's late). A reasonable amount of extra time will be allowed for making up work for full credit due to an excused absence. Tests and quizzes should be scheduled and made up as soon as possible.

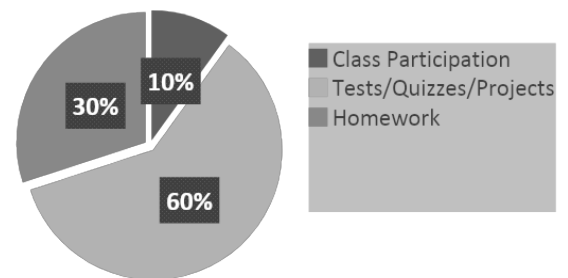
Grading System: Check your grades online frequently using the [Aeries](#) portal. I use the following grading scale:
